Mecklenburg County Detention Center 2021 HiSET Report Highlights the Impact of Educational Programs

(CHARLOTTE, NC) – The Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office is pleased to share highlights from the 2021 High School Equivalency Test (HiSET) Report. When comparing the accomplishment of Mecklenburg County Detention Center – Central (MCDCC) HiSET students to that of the State of North Carolina HiSET students, MCDCC residents compare very favorably. In some cases, MCDCC residents scored higher than average:

"What makes this even more impressive," said Dorian Johnson, MCSO Detention Programs Director, "is that MCDCC residents had inconsistent instruction due to the pandemic, separated from family and natural supports, are in an environment which can be difficult to concentrate all while facing the uncertainty of their court process and future."

According to the Bureau of Justice Statistics Special Report on Education and Correctional Populations, it is estimated that 47% of those housed in county detention centers have not completed high school or its equivalent, while only 18% of the general population (public) failed to graduate from high school.

The HiSET/GED educational program is a partnership between Central Piedmont Community College and the Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office. Residents receive on-site instruction and must take a state test upon completion of the course.
