MECKLENBURG COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PRISON RAPE ELIMINATION ACT (PREA) 2019 ANNUAL REPORT

Background

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) was passed by Congress and signed into law by President George W. Bush in 2003 to prevent, detect and respond to sexual abuse and sexual harassment that occurs in confinement settings. The National Prison Rape Elimination Commission developed national standards which apply to adult prisons and jails, juvenile facilities, lockups and community confinement facilities.

Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office Zero-Tolerance Policy

The Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) has a zero tolerance towards all forms of sexual abuse and sexual harassment within Mecklenburg County Detention facilities and will prevent, detect and respond to any such activity. MCSO will immediately respond to allegations, fully investigate reported alleged incidents, pursue disciplinary action based upon the outcome of the investigations and in accordance with the PREA standards, and refer for prosecution those who perpetrate prohibited conduct.

MCSO has a designated agency wide PREA Coordinator and PREA Compliance Managers for both of its facilities. MCSO has revised existing policies in accordance with the PREA standards. Other efforts to comply with the PREA standards include, but not limited to:

- Annual training for staff, volunteers and contractors;
- Collaboration with the local Rape Crisis Center;
- Implementation of internal confidential reporting hotline;
- Implementation of external confidential reporting on website;
- Conducted resident education training;
- Conducted monthly PREA Incident Review meetings on all substantiated and unsubstantiated cases;
- Conducted refresher training for supervisors; and
- Completed a successful Department of Justice PREA Audit.

PREA Statistics

MCSO collects data in accordance with §115.87 to assess and improve the effectiveness of its sexual abuse prevention, detection, and response policies, practices, and training. In subsequent years, the information collected for this report will be used to identify problem areas and take corrective action on an ongoing basis.

Survey of Sexual Violence, 2018

During 2018, there were a total of 20,456 new admissions into the Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Office. Of the new admissions, 16,734 were males and 3,722 were female. The average daily population was 1,415 males and 130 females.
